

## Other funding information

### ARTS BOARD

The Arts Board approved a range of projects in its 2006/2007 budget, including the following residencies: the Creative New Zealand Berlin Visual Artists' Residency (\$66,000); the Sanskriti Residency in New Delhi (\$15,000); the Red Gate Residency in Beijing (\$15,000); the *Wild Creations* residencies (\$22,500); the 2006 Fulbright Creative New Zealand Pacific Writers' Residency in Hawai'i (\$20,000); the 2007 Artists to Antarctica programme (\$20,000).

The following fellowships were approved: the 2007 Creative New Zealand Craft/Object Art Fellowship (\$68,000); the 2007 Creative New Zealand Michael King Writers' Fellowship (\$100,000); the 2008 Creative New Zealand Choreographic Fellowship (\$68,000) and the Craft/Object Art Curatorial Internship in association with The Dowse and the Doreen Blumhardt Arts Trust (\$15,000).

The Arts Board contributed \$20,000 to an exhibition of works by previous Artists to Antarctica Fellows.

### PACIFIC ARTS COMMITTEE

The Pacific Arts Committee approved \$33,000 for the 2006 Arts Pasifika Awards, \$12,500 for the 2007 Cook Islands Artists' Residency and \$15,000 for the 2007 Samoan Artists' Residency.

Through its out-of-time mechanism, the Pacific Arts Committee approved a grant of \$15,000 to Makerita Urale towards a five-week Canadian tour of "Frangipani Perfume".

### TE WAKA TOI

Te Waka Toi approved a range of initiatives in its 2006/2007 budget, including:

Te Waka Maori exhibition (\$30,000); Te Waka Toi Awards (\$67,500); Toi Tuarangi/ overseas residencies (\$60,000); and the Tohunga Tukunga/mentoring programme (\$60,000).

### SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Creative New Zealand acknowledges the generous support of the Tup Lang Estate, the Todd Foundation and the Edwin Carr Foundation.

Julia Milsom was awarded \$8,064 towards a professional development internship with Magpie Music Dance Co, with the support of the 2006 Tup Lang Choreographic Award worth \$5,000 and an Arts Board grant of \$3,064.

Shona Jones was awarded the \$20,000 Todd Writers' Bursary, a partnership between the Todd Foundation and Creative New Zealand, with each partner contributing \$10,000.

Robin Toan was awarded the 2006 Edwin Carr Foundation Scholarship of \$20,000 towards composition study in Europe.

### RECURRENT FUNDING ROUND 2006/2007

Creative New Zealand offered grants to 35 professional arts organisations for their programmes of activity over the 2007 calendar year.
